SMPA Partners with San Miguel County for Microgrid Projects at Sheriff's Offices in Ilium, Norwood

"Micro-what?" you might ask. In the electric industry, the term "Microgrid" refers to an electric distribution construction that has at least one distributed energy resource and associated loads and can operate independently of the larger power grid. "Think of it as an island," says SMPA Key Accounts Executive, Terry Schuyler. "When it isn't receiving power from the surrounding distribution system, this network of poles, wires, batteries and generators can provide its own power." It's an attractive concept for those with "mission-critical" systems that ought not to go down at all. One such organization is the San Miguel County (SMC) Sheriff's Office.



Interested in the energy resiliency offered by a microgrid construction, with solar / battery generator component, SMC reached out to SMPA to see what could be done. SMPA assisted San Miguel County in applying for a Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) \$1.1M grant that included two Solar PV / Energy Storage Microgrid Systems for two different Sheriff Office locations.

The full project included seven PV systems totaling 264 kW PV, and 190 kW/580kWh battery Energy Storage for "Mission Critical Load" resiliency SMPA Support included:

- Solar and battery system design support
- Critical load determination
- Grant writing support
- Various beneficial electrification, solar PV, and battery system rebates
- Interconnection and Net Metering agreements



The beneficiaries are two crucial parts of the Sheriff's department: The San Miguel County Sheriff Annex Building in Norwood and the San Miguel County Ilium Sheriff Office near Telluride. In both cases, a solar / battery system was designed to ensure 100% reliability in case of backup generator failure or lack of fuel supply. Mission critical loads include:

- Lighting circuits throughout building
- Receptacles throughout the buildings
- Communications / internet
- Control room
- IT server / radio rooms
- Protective Custody / locks

"We greatly appreciate the effort and expertise offered by SMPA," Ouray County Commissioner, Lynn Padgett. "Shoring up critical loads provides an extra layer of security against crisis or emergency."


