Lynne took the first steps toward a more energy-efficient mobile home by completing and submitting the application. Then, a qualified technician visited and conducted a walk-through inspection and prepared a report.

This report would determine which weatherization projects would follow. "They put insulation around the hot water heater; then between the ceiling and the roof and in the crawl space," said Lynne. These improvements were made at no cost to her.
